1835 Town Hall Committee



Report to the Board of Selectmen June 24, 2016

Accomplished: Named Rooms at the Town Hall:

The 1835 Town Hall Committee has assigned names to all the rooms at the Town Hall in place of room numbers. The names selected by the Committee honor the contributions of individuals, past and present, that have contributed a great deal to the Town History, Center and to the Town Hall.

- The Edwin Conant Room (Meeting Room 1)
- Arthur P. Rugg Room (Large Room on first floor)
- John Springer Hallway (Hallway) John was the builder of the building
- Lady Marion Wilder Room (The New Conference Room and SHC Room prior Veterans Office)
- C. Vernon Gaw Room (Rec Department Office)
- The Great Hall (remains the Great Hall upstairs)

Plaques will be created for all rooms. An example is the plaque now hanging for the Edwin Conant room:

EDWIN CONANT ROOM

Born August 20, 1810 to Jacob Conant and Relief Burpee Conant. Edwin grew up in Sterling attending local schools until he was 12 years old and then attended Leicester Academy. In 1826, he entered Harvard University and Harvard Law School graduating in the famous Class of 1829.

He returned to Sterling to teach school at the Chocksett Hill School and opened his law practice here in 1832. His heart always remained with the people of Sterling. Such a prominent citizen, in 1832, he was asked to give the 4th of July speech honoring the anniversary of the Town of Sterling. He spoke:

"...In the upright and honest discharge of public and private duty within our narrow spheres of action, let us do what we can... that the fair model we hold up for the world to admire and imitate may ever be kept in the freshness of original beauty,"

In November 1835, Edwin made the dedicatory address for this Town Hall.

He was father to Elizabeth Ann Conant who died in 1883. In her memory, he donated the funds for the building of the Conant Public Library in 1885. Edwin died at his home in Worcester March 2, 1891.

Accomplished: New Conference Room Available at the Town Hall:

With the contribution of a conference table purchased by the Sterling Historical Commission, chairs donated by Transportation Resources, Inc. and labor provided by Bob Jones, Ron Pichierri and Rob Barwise, we have cleared out the Veteran's Office and created a very nice home for the Sterling Historical Commission and a general use conference room capable of seating 7 individuals and a few spectators. The room has been decorated with historic photographs from the Sterling Historical Society archives. The room is now available for use for both public and private meetings.



In the Works: Use of Town Hall for Exhibits:

Use of Town Hall for Art Exhibitions. We have been requested to consider making space available for public and private art exhibitions. The Committee has approved, in concept, the use of the Town Hall for such exhibitions. We believe it would be of great benefit to the Town Hall and the Community. We have drawn up preliminary policies which protect the building, set forth the use of the venues and protect the public nature of the Town Hall. I have attached the policies for review by the Board. Town Counsel may need to be consulted.

We are planning to test build modular walls for use in the Arthur P. Rugg Room (Large Room on first floor) that will be constructed such that they can be repaired and repainted if necessary, moved around the room for the best lighting and visitor flow patterns, strong enough to erect shelving for crafts and mobile enough to be removed to the basement when not in use.

Update: Septic connection to Firehouse leaching area:

We are seeking the second 3rd portion of the original \$9,700 proposal for the septic plan provided by Cabco to continue with the plan development. This will involve some digging in and around the location of the Ditch, now drainage line between the Town Hall and the Fire House. This will be roughly \$3,200. The Committee is also reviewing records back to the early 19th century, specifically deeds, easements, agreements.

Update: Roof restoration:

We have reviewed in great detail the engineering plans from the 2012 study which we obtained last month. These plans do not have sufficient detail and planning for the repair of joists, leveling and reinforcement of rafters and replacement of the roof sheathing for us to begin to obtain contractor bids. This is contrary to what we had thought considering the great expense. The plans we have were developed around a <u>complete</u> renovation which was not approved and renders the plans useless for the purposes of simply repairing the roof.

We have a consensus on what we need, but without a detailed engineering plan for the repair and renovation, we cannot proceed. The 1835 Town Hall Committee is asking for the authority to obtain bids to obtain engineering plans for roof repair as soon as possible. An estimate would be \$10,000 to \$15,000. The ultimate goal of presenting costs to the finance committee by year end to insure roof replacement in 2017.

New: Installation of Kitchenette:

We are still looking to add a small kitchenette which will allow Town Hall users to make a cup of coffee, wash a cup, refrigerate milk or cream, etc. We have met with the Board of Health and they have no problem as long as we do not change the current use of the building. It will not. It merely enhances the venue.

A kitchenette would include a counter (not to exceed 5 feet in length) with cabinets below and above, small sink, running hot and cold water; electricity for coffee machine, microwave, small refrigerator. The placement has not been confirmed and the Committee will work with Tom Rutherford to select the most appropriate location considering required venting, electric and plumbing.

We will be seeking donated products and have some already including a small refrigerator, small microwave, cabinet and counter top). We will also look for some donated carpentry services, but a licensed electrician and plumber will be required. The cost for this will not exceed \$5,000 in both materials and labor.

The Committee seeks authorization from the Board of Selectmen.
